Reviewing the Principles

The goal of teachers

- To enable students to communicate in the TL through linguistic forms, meanings, and functions
- To provide the knowledge of social context and roles of interlocutors

The role of the teacher

- Facilitates communication in the class
- Acts as an advisor, answering the questions and monitoring student performance

The role of students

- Communicators
- Actively engaged in negotiating meaning
- Responsible for their learning

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Characteristics of teaching/learning process

- Everything is done with a communicative intent
- Communicative activities have three features:
 - Information gap
 - Choice
 - Feedback
- The use of authentic materials
- Activities are carried out in small groups

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Student-teacher interaction

- The teacher presents some part of lesson
- Co-communicator

Student-student interaction

- Students interact a great deal one another in pairs, triads, small groups and whole group

Feelings of students

- Students get the opportunity to express themselves
- Security is enhanced through cooperation

Language

- Language is for communication
- Linguistic competence is a part of communicative competence

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Culture

- The everyday lifestyle of people who use the language
- The use of nonverbal behavior

Areas of Language

- Language functions over language forms
- Students work with the language at the discourse and suprasentential level
- They learn coherence and cohesion

Language Skills

- All four skills from the beginning

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Native Language

- NL is permitted but TL is a vehicle for communication not just an object to be studied

Evaluation

- Based on student performance
- Focus is on both accuracy and fluency
- An integrative test that has a communicative function is used

Error Correction

- Errors are tolerated during fluency-based activities
- They are seen as a natural outcome of the development of communication skills
- Errors can be corrected during accuracy-based activities
